
Keo Seima Wildlife Sanctuary REDD+ Project

INVESTMENT PRIORITIES



The Keo Seima Wildlife Sanctuary REDD+ Project will use carbon revenues to strengthen and expand a number of priority interventions that are strategically placed inside and outside the project area.



Local villages with Indigenous Land Titles (ICTs) or Community Protected Areas (CPAs) secured or in progress as a result of the REDD+ project



Jahoo Gibbon Camp

An eco-tourism venture offering exclusive tours to see unique gibbons and other primates within the biodiversity hotspot. Linking conservation action to community development.



Ranger Stations

The Project currently supports 12 ranger stations. Rangers have been working to dissuade poaching, illegal logging, and illegal forest conversion to agriculture since before the project inception.



IBIS Rice Initiatives

Ibis Rice is a wildlife-friendly ethically-driven conservation enterprise, working with local farmers to protect the ecosystem while growing premium organic jasmine rice with above-market returns. Currently operating in O Chra, Pu Char and Pu Kong.



Community Patrol Units

The project works with local villages to establish Community Patrols, where local community members work government-backed rangers to protect their land titles and traditionally used areas. 8 units are currently active across the project zone.



Infrastructure Development

The REDD+ funds are utilized for various infrastructure projects prioritized based on community needs, including drinking water wells, roads and drainage, school building renovations and new community meeting halls



Mobile Health Clinics

Supporting healthcare through mobile clinics implemented in coordination with the Italian Association for Aid to Children in Cambodia (CIAI) and the Provincial Health Department. Improving quality of healthcare and sanitation in remote villages.
